ARRANGING A SERVICE

There are a number of things you may wish to take into account before preparing your funeral wishes.

- 1. Will it be cremation or burial?
- 2. If a burial where?
- 3. If a cremation where?
- 4. Do you wish to have a church service?
- 5. Do you wish the service to take place in a crematorium or church?
- 6. Will it be a religious ceremony or would you rather a celebrant or humanist take the service?

A celebrant will conduct a service which is a celebration of life and will add a hymn or a prayer should you wish, but the service will be less religious than that taken by a Minister.

A humanist will not add any religious content.

Once you know what sort of service you wish to have, you need to think about what you would like included in the service. You may already know exactly what you want, but if you are unsure, here are some ideas:

- 1. If you have decided upon having a service in a crematorium, the service time will be limited to a maximum of 30 minutes. You can have a double time if you need longer but 30 minutes is the normal length and your family will be charged more for any additional time.
- 2. If you are having a service in a church the timing is more flexible.
- 3. If you are being cremated, you could have a church service and then the committal at the crematorium.

For a normal 30 minute service the following is an idea of what you could expect to have in the service.

THE SERVICE

Entry music

For a service in a crematorium there will be a wide choice of hymns, songs and other music available from their library or you can provide music on your own CD. If you are having a church service you may need to be a little more conservative regarding your choice of music. An organist will usually play at the church, however, they can also be made available at a crematorium.

The welcome

This is usually given by the officiate conducting the service.

The eulogy

This can be given by either the person conducting the service, a member of the family or by a friend.

Prayers

Prayers are always included in a religious service but can also be included when the funeral is conducted by a celebrant, but not a humanist.

Hymns/songs or other music

Your favourite pieces of music can be played during the service.

A piece of poetry

This is often read by a family member or friend. This may be an option for a loved one who would like to be actively involved in the service but would find the longer eulogy too emotional.

Committal

This is the point where we say goodbye to our loved one and is usually performed by the person conducting the service. This is the part of the service that gives everyone a moment for reflection. You can either choose for this to be done in silence or with music playing quietly in the background.

Exit music

As with the entry music.

The Order of Service can either be printed in a booklet form to enable the mourners to follow the service and retain as a keepsake or can be used solely by the officiate as a guide for the ceremony.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Coffin

Nowadays there are so many choices. You may wish for a traditional wood coffin or casket or maybe one woven from wicker, bamboo, seagrass, wool or other environmentally friendly materials or even a colourful coffin, printed with appropriate artwork.
